SETTING UP YOUR ABSTRACT FOR CONFERENCE BOOKLET

A. Guidelines

1. Abstracts should use unicode wherever possible and may be sent in .txt, .rtf, .doc or .odt format.
2. Use times 12 pts wherever possible
3. Length should not exceed 1 page, references and material other than text included.
4. Paragraphs should not be indented, but separated by a blank line.
5. Material other than text - special symbols, aligned glosses, tables, figures, graphics, etc. - should be sent in separate files, .jpg (300 dpi).
6. References should be formatted in APA style.
